CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST OCTOBER 2015

The 20-Ghost Club returned to the Republic of Ireland in 2015 with John Redmill and his partner Desmond Barry organising not one but two tours. The first was a joint tour with the Irish Georgian Society, with whom the Club has had a close association for many years. These joint tours have been much appreciated by our members as they provide an opportunity to see inside stately homes that are not normally open to the public. With the contacts and connections that both John and Desmond have, as a result of their architectural conservation work, there is always a warm welcome from owners who, these days, don't often see a procession of vintage Rolls-Royce cars grace their driveways.

On the main 20-Ghost Club tour of South West Ireland, 22 pre-war vehicles demonstrated that the marque can survive all weathers. Yes, it does rain in the Green Isle but we also enjoyed some beautiful days and spectacular scenery around the Sheep's Head Peninsula and the Ring of Kerry. And there were more warm welcomes at the houses we visited as well as being royally entertained by John and Desmond at their attractive Pier Cottage on the Castlehaven inlet.

The year began with the usual enjoyable Spring Lunch at the Macphersons in Hampshire which was also the venue for a short weekend tour, including a visit to Wilton House, where we were greeted by the Earl of Pembroke; Danebury Vineyards, where we welcomed by the owner Mr Ernst Piech; St Cross Hospital in Winchester, where we welcomed by our member and chairman William Corbett and his wife Clare; and finally at Lasham Airfield, where owners allowed other members to drive their cars.

A most enjoyable Concours, planned by Brian Palmer, at Broughton Castle gave an opportunity for members in the Midlands and the North to have a shorter drive to an event. Lord Saye and Sele welcomed us and we were delighted that our Honorary President, HRH The Duke of Gloucester, was free to join us and present the Concours awards.

Other tours in the year included a visit to the Chalke Valley History Festival in the Wiltshire countryside coupled with visits to nearby National Trust properties; three nights in the Lake District; and two nights at Stratford to see an excellent production of Henry V.

The Club is in excellent heart. The net increase in members during the year was 21. Thus at 31 October 2015 the total membership was 339 (2014: 318). We were delighted that Jane Pedler, Chairman of the Sir Henry Royce Memorial Foundation, accepted our invitation to become an Honorary Member of the Club, ex officio. On a sadder note, we recorded, with deep regret, the passing of one the great enthusiasts and curators of the old car movement, Lord Montagu, an honorary member of the Club who supported us in many ways, not least waving us all off from Bucklers Hard at the start of the memorable 2004 Centenary Tour of France.

Financially, we are in good shape, with a small surplus in 2014/15 of almost £4,000, which will go towards improving the efficiency of the Club and its services to members. Of particular mention is the money currently being spent to upgrade the Club's database by replacing the FileMaker system that was installed many years ago. The new database will be integrated with the Club's website which will be made easier to access by members. Further information about this will be communicated to members in the next two issues of *News & Record*. The new system is expected to be "live" by the middle of 2016.

Two Committee members are stepping down from their roles, after many years' service, at the forthcoming AGM.

Nigel Hughes has been a member of the Club for many decades and a valued Committee member. He was the first Editor of *News & Record* in 2001 and designed and maintained the Club's first website, providing all its written content and photographs. In recent years Nigel has managed the Club's database, contributed articles on technical matters to *News & Record*. He has been a frequent attender on Club events in his Silver Ghost and now in a more comfortable 20/25. The Committee is pleased to bestow on Nigel the privilege of Honorary Membership of the Club. We are also delighted that Henry Fitzhugh has agreed to take over from Nigel as Database Manager.

Brian Fidler has been our Treasurer for the last eight years. Apart from keeping us on the straight and narrow financially and preparing annual accounts as well as periodic reports to the Committee, he has triumphed in a very material way. When he took over as Treasurer, about £43,000 was on deposit with a bank in the Isle of Man, which encountered financial problems. At one stage it looked as though the Club would suffer a total loss of this deposit, which would have almost wiped out the Club's reserves. Through diligence and persuasion, involving much correspondence and careful action, Brian succeeded in recouping the entirety of the Club's funds. And that's not all. Despite rising costs, he has been able to hold the membership subscription constant for seven years in a row as a result of careful budgeting and financial control. On stepping down as Treasurer, we are delighted that Brian has agreed to become an honorary Vice-President of the Club and that he will be remaining on the Committee for the time being. His successor as Treasurer is Philip Hall who is well known in the Rolls-Royce world as a former Chief Executive (for many years) and a current Trustee of the Sir Henry Royce Memorial Foundation. We are delighted to welcome Philip to the Club's Committee.

Next year, we are looking forward to a variety of activities including several short UK events which should appeal to small HP car owners as well as the longer legged models: The AGM and Annual Dinner at Armourers & Braziers Hall in the City of London; the annual Spring Lunch at the Macphersons; a morning's visit to the Hunt House to view the Foundation's and our Club's records which are held there; a two week tour of France finishing in Biarritz; an Irish Georgian Weekend in Cornwall; a Mozart concert at Thurgarton Priory, courtesy of Committee member Roland Duce; Driving Tests, a Concours and Picnic at Sandhurst; and a tour of Wales, starting in the south and finishing in the north. For those wanting a longer tour, a journey through Spain and Portugal is being planned for June 2017.

We are grateful to those members who take a huge amount of effort and time to organise these events and to members whose presence, with their stunning cars, is always appreciated and enjoyed.

A full provision of £42,455 was made for the bank deposits held by Kaupthing Singer & Friedlander (Isle of Man) Limited "the Bank" in the accounts to 31st October 2008.
